- Students will contextualize, evaluate, and interpret primary source materials within broad scholarly debate to create a meaningful contribution to historical scholarship.
- Students will examine a broad variety of source materials as part of in-depth research to answer historical questions using rigorous critical analysis.
- Students will formulate concrete historical questions, a reasonable plan of research, and carry it through successfully in a timely manner (ideally two years for full-time M.A. students) that culminates in a thesis with major argument based in primary evidence.
- Students will communicate research findings and interpretation in formal academic manners, orally and in writing, culminating in a sustained argument presented in a thesis of appropriate length (approximately 100 pages).
- Students will develop and refine organizational and writing skills to serve their research.
